Dear Hillier Scholarship Recipients;

Since 1997, the James Hillier Foundation has bestowed scholarships for university to Brantford and Brant County high school students wishing to pursue a career in scientific research. This year marks the 27th year for the program and including this year's recipients, 82 local students have been awarded university scholarships. To date, the Foundation has provided over \$1,342,000 in scholarships.

This year the Foundation was pleased to offer four scholarships. High school students Torrin Bigrigg from St. Johns College, Noah Goncalves from Assumption College, Jeremy Hoare from Paris District High School, and Tatyana Zebroski from Brantford Collegiate Institute are the recipients of full four-year \$20,000 scholarships from the James Hillier Foundation.

Celebrating 25 years of granting scholarships. Students visit the Canadian Centre for Electron Microscopy at McMaster University

To commemorate this milestone, the James Hillier Foundation partnered with the Canadian Centre for Electron Microscopy (CCEM) located at McMaster University. It was hoped to send students from area high schools to the Centre for a tour, informational seminars and up-close look at today's technology in 2021 (the official anniversary date). Unfortunately, Covid interfered with these plans and the trips had to be delayed. We are pleased to advise that with the lifting of restrictions, 90 students from five area high schools were able to attend. The Foundation covered the cost of transportation and meals. The CCEM covered the cost of their facilities and faculty. By all accounts the trips were a great success.

In addition to having students visit the CCEM, the James Hillier Foundation worked with the CCEM to facilitate the opportunity for two schools, James Hillier Public School, Assumption College, to operate a portable electron microscope.

Staff and students at both schools were trained on the operation of the equipment and students were encouraged to participate in some hands-on learning.
